

Neighbourhood Decorating Grant Guidelines-2024

Grants of up to \$350 will be awarded to Burnaby residents to assist in decorating their homes with Halloween decorations. All grant recipients are required to participate in the Neighbourhood Halloween Decorating Contest and adhere to all contest rules and regulations.

Grant Availability:

- 2+ Houses on the same block: \$350 for each house.
- Residents may apply for grants starting September 4th, 2024, and the deadline to apply for grants is September 20th, 2024
- Successful applicants will be notified on or before September 27th, 2024. Grants will be awarded on a first-come, first-served basis for each quadrant: Brentwood, Lougheed, Metrotown, and Edmonds.
- Grants will be disbursed in November 2024, contingent upon adherence to all criteria and submission of the required documentation.

Objectives:

This program aims to support residents at the neighbourhood level to:

- Inspire residents to connect with their neighbours.
- Encourage resident involvement in making their neighbourhoods more welcoming and vibrant.
- Create a community engagement piece that is part of the Burnaby Halloween Festival.

The desired outcomes of the Neighbourhood Grant are as follows:

- Residents will contribute their time and expertise to support the Burnaby Halloween Festival.
- Residents will actively engage in making their neighbourhoods better places to live.
- Residents' attachment to the community will be deepened and strengthened.

Applicant Profile:

- Applicants must reside within the City of Burnaby and focus on connecting and engaging with neighbours to create a show-stopping Halloween display in their neighbourhood.
- Applicants must involve at least one other neighbour from a different household in the grant project (Neighbourhood refers to the immediate area that surrounds someone's residence, including gardens or laneways).
- A floor or entire apartment/condominium building is also considered a neighbourhood within the Neighbourhood Grant program. Groups of neighbours within these buildings are welcome to apply, but the display must be visible from the sidewalk or public street.

Eligibility:

To participate in this program, applicants must:

- Live in the City of Burnaby.
- Plan to decorate their residence with Halloween décor.
- Participate in the Neighbourhood Halloween Decorating Contest and comply with all contest

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rules and regulations.

- Identify a working group that includes a minimum of one additional neighbour from a separate household.

Ineligible applications are:

- Applications that do not align with the program objectives, guiding principles, and/or eligibility requirements.
- Applications where the mandate, operations, or activities are inconsistent with the grant's goals.

Eligible Activities and Expenses:

- Equipment, materials and other items that contribute to building an awesome Halloween display.
- Equipment rental

Ineligible Activities and Expenses:

- Retroactive projects and expenses.
- Travel expenses.
- Commercial/business activity.
- Volunteer honorariums.
- Any display in violation of City bylaws.
- Block parties where funds are used exclusively for food and drink.

Application Process:

The application must meet all eligibility requirements and include:

- A brief explanation of how each house will use the Halloween decorating grant.
- Residential addresses of the applicant and participating neighbours to confirm that all participants reside in Burnaby.

Applications must be submitted by 20 September at 11:59 PM PST.

Additional Requirements:

- Projects must comply with all City of Burnaby bylaws.
- If decorating within a Strata-managed property, written approval from the Strata Council must be obtained before applying.

Residents considering submitting an application are encouraged to:

- Review both grant and contest guidelines
- Contact Tourism Burnaby staff in case of any further queries to discuss program eligibility or obtain more information.

Submission of an application does not guarantee funding. Obtaining a grant is a competitive process, and demand often exceeds available resources. If you encounter difficulties accessing the form, please contact apaul@tourismburnaby.com for assistance or to request a paper copy of the application.

Evidence Report:

Successful applicants must provide an Evidence Report, which will be sent out along with the grant acceptance letter. A completed report is required to fulfill the grant application process and receive funding. This report may also be used in the assessment of any future applications by the organization.

- Evidence Reports must be submitted within 15 days of the project's completion (no later than November 15th, 2024), unless alternative arrangements have been made with staff.
- As the project concludes:
 - Recipients must complete and submit a short project evaluation form detailing the project's impact on the neighbourhood.
 - As part of the evidence report, applicants must provide a final budget, including receipts and documentation of all monetary contributions.
 - Recipients must provide a summary paragraph and a minimum of three photographs of the project, with signed photo release forms.
 - Failure to submit an Evidence Report will result in forfeiture of the funding and may affect future eligibility.

- **Online Voting Opens:**
 - Friday, October 25th - Tuesday, October 29th, 2024
- **Winners Announcement**
 - Wednesday, October 30th, 2024
 - Winners will be announced on the Explore Burnaby social media channels and via email.
